LOGLINE

Iqrit is not to be found on any of today's maps of Israel. Its houses were destroyed, its land confiscated, but the village Church still stands and used for religious services.

SYNOPSIS

Until 1948 Iqrit was a flourishing and prosperous Christian village in northern Galilee. Then came the Israeli War of Independence, named Naqba (Catastrophe) by the Palestinians, because they were forced to leave their villages and towns in hundreds of thousands. Iqrit is one such village. Until the present day no residents have been allowed to return there and rebuild it, despite numerous court rulings being made which specifically allowed this. However, Church services are still permitted to be held there, and on High Feast days thousands make a pilgrimage to the ramshackle Church, the only building still left standing in the village.



ABOUT THE FILM

The once bustling village of Iqrit in northern Israel exists today only with a Christian church and a cemetery remaining, as the Israeli army in 1951 destroyed all its houses and then, 2 years later, confiscated its land. Despite numerous rulings of the High Court, which gave the residents of Iqrit the right of return, the villagers are only allowed spend time there during daylight hours. Since 1971, a permanent return to Iqrit is only possible after death inside a coffin and burial in the cemetery. A group of young men stand at odds with this ruling. Among them, the 22 year old philosophy student Amir, whose grandfather had had to leave the village when he was 19. In 2012 these young men decided to return to Iqrit. They regularly stay overnight in an improvised shelter attached to the church and organise celebrations and activities which include planting trees and shrubs. Amir says they play out 'a cat and mouse game' with the Israeli authorities. "Whenever the authorities confiscate the trees and shrubs we plant new ones again". Like his grandfather, Amir cherishes the hope of returning to live in Iqrit that once was home.



DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT BY CHRISTIAN WALTHER

«I want to tell the story of a group of people who lived in Palestine before the foundation of the State of Israel. They had nothing to do with the events in Europe in World War Two. But nonetheless had to suffer the consequences of them, as did hundreds of thousands of other Palestinians.

For me, it is not only the theme of the film that is important, but also those who collaborated in the project too. And so I have deliberately chosen to work with a Jewish-Israeli Camera-woman and a Muslim-Palestinian Sound Engineer. For some years now, encounters between Israelis and Palestinians have become increasingly rare. The separation is very noticeable. Neither side hardly knows the other.»
